Resolution 18: Postponing Spring 2020 Executive Board Elections and Extending Expiring Seats

- 3 Abstract: This resolution postpones 2020 Executive Board elections and also extends the expiring
- 4 seats of the GPSA Executive Board.

5 Sponsored by: GPSA Executive Board

- 6 Whereas, the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has greatly impacted campus-wide operations and
- 7 modified the timeline of priorities for the Graduate and Professional Student Assembly and other
- 8 assemblies for the remaining of 2019-2020 academic calendar; and
- 9 Whereas, Section 5.02 of the GPSA Charter mandates that officers of the GPSA shall "be elected at
- 10 the last regularly scheduled meeting of the current GPSA term"1; and
- 11 Whereas, the Student Assembly₂, the Employee Assembly₃, and the University Assembly₄ voted to
- 12 postpone and extend the seats of their leadership teams; and
- 13 **Whereas,** the administration has strongly recommended that the current GPSA Executive Board to 14 extend their term until the fall 2020; and
- 15 Whereas, the second and last term of the Dean of the Graduate School will expire in the summer;
- 16 and a new Dean of the Graduate School will start their term mid-summer; and
- 17 Whereas, a new GPSA leadership team would not have the resources and institutional knowledge to
- 18 support the new Dean of the Graduate School and help them navigate the GPSA's role in shared 19 governance; and
- 20 Whereas, the GPSA has advertised elections since early April and has met a lack of interest and/or
- 21 engagement from the greater student body.
- Be it therefore resolved, the election of the GPSA Executive Board be postponed until the Fall of2020.
- 24 **Be it further resolved,** that graduating executive members are ineligible and unable to have their
- 25 term extended and will not be replaced, until a new executive member is elected in the fall.

- serve in their respective roles after the third regularly scheduled meeting in the next session of the
 Assembly for the 2020-2021 Academic Calendar.

Resolution 19: In Appreciation and Recognition of Dean Barbara Knuth's Tenure as Dean of the Graduate School

- 4 *Abstract:* This resolution publicly recognizes and thanks Dean Barbara Knuth for her outstanding
- 5 leadership and dedication to graduate education during her two five-year term as Dean of the
- 6 Graduate School at Cornell University.
- 7 Sponsored by: GPSA Executive Board

8 Whereas, Dean Barbara Knuth has served two consecutive, five-year terms as Dean of the

- 9 Graduate School at Cornell University since 2010; and
- 10 Whereas, during her tenure as Dean of the Graduate School, Dean Knuth has been a strong
- 11 advocate and ally for graduate student education; and
- 12 Whereas, as Dean of the Graduate School, she has demonstrated an unwavering leadership and has
- 13 been a steady hand during times of crises, ensuring that the graduate student experience is successful
- 14 regardless of any hardship or circumstance that arises; and
- 15 Whereas, as Dean of the Graduate School, has championed for Graduate student needs' in
- 16 conversations with the President, Provost, faculty, and directors of graduate study; and
- 17 Whereas, in the words of Provost Kotlikoff, "[Dean Knuth] has been an extraordinary effective
- 18 leader for the Graduate School, improving accountability for student outcomes and graduate
- 19 programs, increasing diversity and improving inclusion, and tirelessly advocating on key issues of
- 20 most concern to graduate education, including immigration reform, financial aid, research support
- 21 and health care coverage1."
- 22 Whereas, in the fall of 2019, she won the Debra W. Stewart Award for Outstanding Leadership in
- 23 Graduate Education, given by the Council of Graduate Schools (CGS), an award that highlights her

24 prowess as a strong leader of Graduate Education among 500 institutions of higher education in the

- 25 United States and Canada; and
- 26 Whereas, Dean Knuth has actively nurtured a close relationship with the GPSA and its leaders and
- 27 was always ready to meet, and address our specific concerns, requests and questions; and

Whereas, Dean Knuth's second and last term as Dean of the Graduate School, comes to an end inJuly 2020.

Resolution 8: A Resolution to Adopt the Graduate and Professional Community Initiative

- 3 Sponsored by: Alexa Cohn, Executive Vice President & Chair of GPCI Committee
- 4 Whereas, the GPSA in 2006-2007 created the Graduate Community Initiative (2007 GCI) to elevate
- 5 discussion around graduate and professional students on campus; and
- 6 Whereas, the GPSA in 2012-2013 wrote a new 5-year strategic plan known as the Graduate and
- 7 Professional Community Initiative (2013 GPCI); and
- 8 Whereas, the GPCI Ad Hoc Committee has evaluated both the 2007 GCI and 2013 GPCI,
- 9 reviewed the progress made since 2013, identified eight major topic areas on which to focus, and
- 10 drafted a full document entitled "Graduate and Professional Community Initiative 2020: A Strategic
- 11 Plan for the Graduate and Professional Student Community"; and
- 12 Whereas, in order to understand the needs of graduate and professional students, the Ad Hoc
- 13 Committee reached out to the graduate and professional student community by organizing town
- 14 halls, meeting with various university administrators and community stakeholders, engaging in
- 15 discussions during GPSA meetings, and soliciting feedback via electronic forms sent to relevant
- 16 communities; and
- 17 **Whereas,** having a strategic plan for the graduate and professional student community that is
- 18 developed collaboratively and comprehensively addresses issues will help the GPSA better advocate
- 19 for the needs of our community; and
- 20 Whereas, the university administration and community stakeholders can use this document to
- 21 better understand the needs of all graduate and professional students and to adopt the
- 22 recommendations in collaboration with GPSA for a better campus community;
- Whereas, the GPSA recommends that the Graduate School will release a progress report of accomplished action items before 2024; therefore, be it
- 25 **Resolved,** that the GPSA adopts the attached Graduate and Professional Community Initiative as
- 26 the five-year strategic plan for GPSA and the graduate and professional community; and
- 27 **Resolved,** that the GPCI Ad Hoc will write the Introduction and Supplementary Appendix to be
- 28 included in the final document; and
- 29 **Resolved**, that this document, whilst expressing GPSA's will on support of the creation of the
- 30 GPCI, although this document requires changes in formatting, grammar, and syntax, that those
- 31 changes in the future, will not in any way change the intent of this Resolution; and
