1 **Resolution 52: Expanding College Credit Limits**

2 **Abstract:** This resolution recommends that colleges respect students' decision-making autonomy
3 by keeping semesterly credit limits at or above 22 credits. The recommendation also permits an
4 exception for first-year students.

11 **Whereas,** the ILR School limits students to taking 18 credits per semester,

12 **Whereas,** the Brooks School of Public Policy limits students to taking 18 credits per semester,

13 **Whereas,** the College of Engineering limits students to 20 credits per semester,

14 **Whereas,** these limits prevent students from taking classes they are interested in, need to
15 graduate, or hope to complete for career purposes,

16 **Whereas,** students beyond their first year have acclimated to Cornell studies to the degree that
17 they can determine their ability to handle a heavier workload,

18 **Whereas,** the College of Arts & Sciences and the College of Agriculture & Life Sciences have
19 already successfully implemented 22 credit limits,

20 **Whereas,** the Nolan School, Dyson School, Human Ecology, and AAP have no publicly
21 available limit on how many credits a student may take in a semester beyond their first year,

22 **Be it therefore resolved,** no college shall maintain a semesterly credit limit for undergraduate
23 students below 22 credits, excepting requirements for students in their first year at Cornell,

24 **Be it finally resolved,** such a change shall be implemented by all colleges by the start of the
25 2026-2027 academic year.
