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Resolution 7: Executive Governance Reform, Part 2

- *Abstract:* This resolution amends the Charter, Bylaws, and Standing Rules to further clarify
 several areas of executive governance.

- 7 *Type of Action:* Internal Policy
- 8 Originally Presented: 11/21/2024
- 9 *Current Status:* Placed on the Third Reading Calendar, 12/05/2024
- 10 Whereas, in the event of a vacancy in the Office of the President, the Assembly must elect a new
- 11 President, with multiple offices having conflicting claims to temporary presidential authority.
- Whereas, there does not exist a Vice President overseeing student life policy, the issues most affecting the undergraduate student body.
- 14 Whereas, the style of Vice President should be reserved for officers overseeing a distinct
- 15 division of interaction with the student body (Policy, Finance, Communications, DEI).
- 16 **Whereas,** the current committee system has an unclear management structure, leading to delays
- in committees being able to operate effectively with high turn-over in Assembly leadership year-over-year.
- 19 **Whereas,** the Office of the Executive Archivist has no clear bylaw-given responsibility, while 20 the modern-day role of the Office has been focused on research.
- 21 Whereas, the Office of the Chief of Staff, the successor to the role of Deputy President, will
- streamline Assembly administrative processes, and ensure activities are more transparent by
- 23 publishing the actions of the Executive Board and Cabinet.
- Be it therefore resolved, proposed amendments to the Bylaws of the Student Assembly shall be based on the official version of the Bylaws as of November 1, 2024.
- 26 **Be it further resolved,** all such instances of "SA" occurring in the Charter of the Student
- 27 Assembly be changed to "Assembly," "Student Assembly," or the possessive versions. The final
- determination shall be drafted by the Office of the Assemblies, with the joint approval of the

- 79 of the Assembly's voting members, except that of the Chief of Staff, which shall be subject
- 80 to two-thirds approval. The newly elected officers will undertake the responsibilities of
- 81 their position at the start of their term on the Assembly. Elections for officers shall be by
- 82 secret ballots. Student Assembly voting members may have one vote for each position to
- 83 *be filled but may not vote for any one individual twice on any ballot.*
