Resolution 45: Assembly Response to Funding

- 3 Abstract: This resolution calls on the Cornell Leadership to provide an update to the Student
- 4 Assembly regarding the recent reported funding being withheld. Additionally, the resolution
- 5 calls on Cornell University leadership to sufficiently consult the Student Assembly prior to any
- 6 changes that are made that affect the student body in relation to these cuts.

- Whereas, on April 8th, 2025, the New York Times reported that Cornell University would have
- many of its federal grants paused, amounting to 1 billion dollars in funding being withheld. This
- 19 report cited two anonymous federal government officials. Following the release of this article,
- 20 President Kotlikoff, Provost Bala, and Provost for Medical Affairs Harrington sent out a
- 21 statement² confirming the cuts, but disputing the reported figure.
- Whereas, the affected grants include research regarding cancer, robotics, superconductors,
- propulsion systems, large-scale information networks, space and satellite communications, as
- 24 well as new materials for jet engines.
- Whereas, many members of Cornell's undergraduate community are alarmed by this news and
- 26 how it may impact their research and employment opportunities offered to them, and available
- 27 fields of study.
- 28 **Be it therefore resolved,** that, pursuant to the Student Assembly Charter Article III, Section 1,
- 29 the Student Assembly thereby requires Cornell leadership to inform the Student Assembly's
- officers regarding the details of the funding cuts and affected grants in a timely manner.
- 31 **Be it further resolved**, the Student Assembly urges Cornell leadership works in tandem with the
- 32 Student Assembly in its first investigative resolution of the 2024-2025 academic year including
