15 16 17 18	Whereas, Joan Ruth Bader attended Cornell University as an undergraduate majoring in government in the College of Arts and Sciences from 1950 through 1954, and;
19 20 21 22 23	Whereas, during her undergraduate career Bader worked as a researcher for professor Robert Cushman, during which time she worked on tracking entertainment industry blacklists during the McCarthy era elevating her awareness of the Constitution and was encouraged by Cushman to apply to law school, and;
23 24 25 26	Whereas, during her time at Cornell, Bader participated in the Women's Self-Governance Association, a student government system within residence life, and;
20 27 28 29	Whereas, during her time at Cornell she met Martin Ginsburg, marrying him shortly after graduating from Cornell, and;
30 31 32 33	Whereas, Ginsburg attended Harvard Law School, subsequently transferring to Columbia Law School, where she tied for first in her graduating class, all while becoming the first woman to be on two major law reviews, the <i>Harvard Law Review</i> and the <i>Columbia Law Review</i> , and;
34 35 36	Whereas, Ginsburg entered academia and served as a professor at Rutgers and Columbia Law Schools, teaching civil procedure, and;
30 37 38 39 40 41	Whereas, throughout her legal career, (*Move previous statement here?*) Ginsburg worked to advance the rights of all people, particularly women and marginalized groups; including volunteer work at the American Civil Liberties Union, where, in 1972, she founded the Women's Rights Project, and;

Whereas, Ginsburg argued six gender discrimination cases before the Supreme Court during the
1970s, winning five, and;

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45 **Whereas,** Ginsburg was nominated by former President Carter to a seat on the United States Court 46 of Appeals for the District of Columbia where she served from the time of her confirmation on

47 June 18, 1980 to her appointment to the United States Supreme Court, and;

49 **Whereas,** Ginsburg was nominated by former President Clinton and appointed as an associate 50 Justice of the Supreme Court on August 10, 1993, and;

52 Whereas, since 1999 Justice Ginsburg battled five bouts of various types of cancer, all the while

53 upholding her promise to, "remain a member of the court as long as I can do the job full steam (M.

- 57 cancer on September 18, 2020 at the age of 87.

64 Justice of the Supreme Court, and;

67 Cornell flags fly at half-staff for the 27 days following the adoption of this resolution,
