4 5	ABSTRACT: This resolution seeks to eliminate the Residential Life Committee

8 9 10	Whereas, the Residential Student Congress is an elected body of undergraduate students with the purpose of representing the residential concerns of students,
11 12 13 14	Whereas, the SA Residential Life Committee has redundant and similar oversight as the Residential Student Congress and the oversight that the Residential Student Congress does not exercise invariably relates to the wellbeing of Cornell students,
15 16 17 18	Be it resolved , The SA Bylaws Article VI: Committees, Section 2, Subsection G be eliminated in its entirety and the appropriate naming of other subsections be held for the rest of Article VI.
19	Be it further resolved , the Student Assembly review committees reserve, can, and should
20	exercise at their discretion legislative authority over residential life policies of the
21	University. When exercising this authority, review committees are recommended to
22	consult the Residential Student Congress of Cornell. Be it finally resolved that the
23	Student Assembly revisit this policy at the beginning of the next semester in discussion
24	with the Residential Student Congress.

26	Be it finally resolved, the Vice President of Internal Operations, at the discretion of
27	committee chairs, will engage applicants to the Residential Life Committee in other
28	capacities in the Student Assembly or through the Residential Student Congress.
