

## Resolution 23: Standing in Solidarity with Uyghur Muslims and Minorities

- 3 Abstract: The resolution denounces the Chinese genocide of Uyghur Muslims and other
- 4 minorities in the Xinjiang region and supports student advocacy efforts against it.

- 8 *Current Status:* New Business
- 9 Whereas, The Chinese government has oppressed Uyghurs and incarcerated more than 1.8
- million Uyghur Muslims and other minorities in concentration camps, prisons, and forced labor
- 11 since 2017;

- Whereas, Chinese party officials have slept in the beds of Uyghur families, demolished mosques
- and Muslim cemeteries, and banned the Uyghur language;
- Whereas, Uyghur Muslims have been arbitrarily detained and forcibly disappeared;
- 15 Whereas, Uyghur Muslims have been subject to forced organ harvesting and sterilization;
- Whereas, the United States has stated that China has committed genocide against Uyghur
- Muslims and other ethnic and religious minority groups in the Xinjiang region;
- Whereas, the United Nations Human Rights Office has stated that these policies may be crimes
- 19 against humanity;
- Whereas, Resolution 39: Calling Upon Cornell to Uphold its Ethical Guidelines for International
- 21 Engagements, passed March 29th, 2021, stated that "Cornell University's relationship with
- 22 China is normalizing the ongoing Uighur genocide" and called for the re-evaluation of Cornell's
- 23 "current international collaborations... using the ethical guidelines on international
- 24 engagement";
- 25 **Whereas**, the Uyghur Policy Act of 2021 has passed the House of Representatives and will soon
- be introduced in the Senate. This bill supports the human rights of Uyghurs and members of
- other minority groups residing in Xinjiang and calls upon the United States Government to
- 28 provide additional support in the region;
- Whereas, the Uyghur Human Rights Protection Act has been introduced in the House of
- 30 Representatives. This bill calls for "Uyghurs and members of other predominantly Turkic or
- Muslim ethnic groups" to be prioritized as refugees, supports "the human rights of Uyghurs and
