- 3 Abstract: The resolution condemns the recent incident of sexual assault and urges the
- 4 administration to take steps to affirm our shared commitment to safety, inclusion, belonging, and
- 5 respect for all Cornellians.

- Whereas, Cornell University is an institution rooted in the ideals of mutual respect, inclusivity,
- and belonging for any person;
- Whereas, to accomplish these goals, Cornell University must also enforce a practice of
- supporting the safety and well-being of all its students, residents, and community members;
- Whereas, this upsetting incident has deeply affected the Cornell community, leaving many to
- 17 question their sense of security and personal safety on our campus;
- 18 Whereas, to date, the Cornell University administration has yet to address this disturbing event,
- or to affirm the University's responsibility and commitment to ensuring student safety;
- 20 **Be it therefore resolved,** the Student Assembly vehemently and unequivocally condemns sexual
- 21 assault;
- 22 **Be it further resolved,** that to reaffirm dedication to maintaining the safety of students of all
- 23 genders, sexual orientations, races, and other identities, the Student Assembly urges the Cornell
- 24 University administration to take overdue action;
- 25 **Be it further resolved,** that the Student Assembly suggests that the administration and the
- 26 Office of Institutional Equity and Title IX commit to consistent reassessment and collaboration
- 27 with the student body to determine the effectiveness of on-campus sexual violence prevention
- 28 resources;
