5	ABSTRACT: This resolution reinstates the Financial Aid Review Committee (FARC) as a byline-funded
6 7	organization for the 2020-2022 byline cycle.

10	Whereas, the Joint Assemblies Financial Aid Review Committee (JAFARC) was created in 1985 to "assist
11	registered Cornell undergraduate students in financial need"
12	registered Somen andelgradaate stadents in marietar need
13	Whereas, JAFARC voluntarily forwent byline funding in the Fall of 2009 "in the interest of being good
14	stewards to the university" due to the financial burden placed on students and their families during the
15	financial crisis
16	
17	Whereas, the decision to forgo funding was made with the understanding that the Appropriations
18	Committee consider FARC "as a continuing applicant should [they] need to request funding in a future cycle,
19	thus not requiring the 1500 signatures that is required of new applicants"
20	
21	Whereas, FARC established the Summer Experience Grant (SEG) in 2014 to "provide students with the
22	opportunity to obtain career-related experience in the summer that is unpaid or minimally paid." (SA AY 14-
23 24	15 Resolution 69)
24	Whereas, FARC awarded \$13,990.06 via the Student Helping Students fund (SHS) and \$48,535.00 via SEG
26	in FY17
27	
28	Whereas, total money awarded via SHS and SEG exceeded total income in FY17 of \$56,577.23
29	
30	Whereas, FARC and the Student Assembly voted to allocate \$320,000 for the development of Anabel's
31	Grocery in SA AY 2015-2016 via Resolution 22 using endowment funds, which significantly impacted total
32	annual returns since
33	
34	Whereas, FARC has seen a significant increase in applications to the SEG since its expansion to all 7 colleges
35	in FY16 and anticipates the number to grow in the coming years
36	
37	<b>Be it finally resolved</b> , the Student Assembly recommends that the Appropriations committee consider
38	FARC as a continuing applicant for the 2020-2022 byline cycles, thus not requiring the 1500 signatures of a
39 40	new organization applying for funding and includes language to this effect in their Appendix B amendments
