Re: Challenge in 2022 Graduate/Professional Student-Elected Trustee election

The Committee for Campus-Constituency-Elected Trustees met today to consider the Challenge you submitted against Alexis Miller in the current Graduate/Professional Student-Elected Trustee election.

The CCCET considered the materials you submitted, as well as a response submitted by Ms. Miller. In the response, Ms. Miller acknowledges having placed posters on the walls of Sage Hall, Myron Taylor Hall, and Ives Hall, but denies having done so repeatedly or egregiously.

The CCCET assessed the challenge against the standard stated in Section VIII.8 of the “Student- and Employee-Elected Trustee Procedure, amended May 26, 2022”: whether there had been “a violation of the rules set forth in these Procedures serious enough to have potentially altered the result of the election.”

The CCCET found by a unanimous vote of the 7 members present that the actions described in the Challenge did not constitute a violation of the Procedures serious enough to warrant disqualification from candidacy, as there was no evidence that the placing of posters was done repeatedly or egregiously. Therefore, the Challenge is denied.
