11	community members in the formulation and review of non-academic policies,
12	recommendations and decisions impacting daily lives on campus;"

14	Whereas, laundry prices and policies impact the daily lives of all undergraduate Cornell students
15	living on-campus, yet fail to include such student voices when written and implemented;

17	Whereas, in conversations that pertain to policies affecting undergraduate students, students should
18	be represented, by students;

20	Whereas, "The assemblies formally advise the administration and recommend changes to policies
21	through legislative processes articulated in their respective charters;"

23	Whereas, Article III, Section I, lines 18-19 of the Cornell University Student Assembly Charter read:
24	"The SA will have legislative authority over the policies of the Department of Campus Life
25	and the Office of the Dean of Students, and will have the authority to review the budgets
26	and actions of said departments;"

28	Whereas, laundry services fall under Residential Life, and thus the Department of Campus Life;

30	Whereas, the Cornell University Student Assembly unanimously passed Resolution #41, creating
31	the ad-hoc Housing Policy Review committee;"
