Resolution 73: Approving Special Projects Funding Request for Farmers' Market at Cornell

Abstract: This resolution approves \$5,000.00 of Special Projects Funding to the Farmers' Market
 at Cornell to partially fund their Farmers' Market event on April 18th, 2024.

11 Whereas, the Student Assembly Standing Rules, Rule 12: Spending Guidelines, Part B: Special

- Projects Funding outlines the purpose of Special Projects Funding and the process of approving
 funding requests.
- Whereas, Part B: Special Projects Funding, section a, of the Student Assembly Standing Rulesexplains the purpose of Special Projects Funding as follows:
- 16 section a: The Student Assembly may choose to fund any project, program or service
- 17 through SA Special Projects that it deems to improve the quality of undergraduate student
- 18 life or to further the goals of the SA. Special Projects funding is a type of category
- 19 spending.
- Whereas, Part B: Special Projects Funding, section e, of the Student Assembly Standing Rules
 describes the approval process of Special Projects Funding as follows:
- section e: Requests \$1,500 and over shall be decided upon by a majority vote of the
- 23 Executive Committee and confirmed by a majority vote of the Student Assembly, at
- 24 large. The Assembly, at large, is only required to confirm requests of \$1,500 or greater.
- 25 The request should be presented to the Student Assembly in the form of a resolution.
- 26 Whereas, the Farmers' Market at Cornell is a weekly market that fosters a safe and healthy
- 27 spaces where students, faculty and staff come together to interact with the local community and
- support small businesses, promoting an appreciation for local farmers and vendors, and
- 29 ultimately creates a centerpiece that helps build community and belonging to Cornell University
- 30 and Ithaca.

- 31 Whereas, the Farmers' Market will launch April 18th from 11am-2pm on the AG Quad. Based
- 32 on past attendance (pre-pandemic + marketing interactions, they expect a turnout of \sim 1,000.
- 33 Recurring costs include: parking permits for vendors, payment to facilities for set up and use of
- 34 tents and electricity, as well as merch to resale for fundraising.
- 35 Be it further resolved, that the Student Assembly approves the \$5,000.00 Special Projects
- 36 Funding disbursement to the Farmers' Market at Cornell.
- 37 Be it finally resolved, that the Student Assembly necessitates that this funding be used to cover38 the cost of the Farmers' Market event on April 18th.
