11 Whereas, the Charter of the Student Assembly in Article II charges the Student Assembly with

12 the responsibility to "examine any matters which involve the interests or concern the welfare of

13 the student community and to make proposals concerning those issues to the appropriate officers

14 or decision-making bodies of the University;"

Whereas, collaboration with the broader student body, including with community members and student organizations, is critical to supporting the passage and implementation of SA resolutions;

17 Whereas, members of the SA ought to work towards the University's successful implementation

- 18 of their resolutions, including through mobilizing supportive community members;
- 19 **Be it therefore resolved,** all future SA resolutions, save for Internal Policy Resolutions, must
- 20 have a listed Community Sponsor.

# Resolution 10: Requiring the VP of Finance to be granted full Admin Access on Campus Groups

- *Abstract:* This resolution reinstates the VP of Finance admin-level access on the CampusGroups
   platform to ensure efficient operations throughout the 2023-2024 Academic Year.

10 Whereas, in the Fall of 2019, Cornell University switched from OrgSync to CampusGroups as

- 11 the new Organization Management system moving forward.<sup>1</sup>

13 Whereas, Cornell University, the Department of Student and Campus Life, and Campus

Activities still utilize the Campus Groups as the primary platform to house information about

- 15 organizations (IT, EO, and Department) on campus.<sup>2</sup>
- 16
- 17 Whereas, the CampusGroups platform houses important information about campus
- organizations such as emails, lists of membership, events schedules, surveys & forms,
- accounting books, website links, files uploaded, and revenue money.<sup>3</sup>

21 Whereas, on August 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, the current VP of Finance received an email from the CORE

- 22 CampusGroups team at Cornell, indicating that after conducting their annual review of admin
- 23 users, the VP of Finance would no longer have admin access to the platform effective
- immediately, despite the VP of Finance having admin access in the 2022-2023 AY.

26 Whereas, since all information related to campus organizations is housed in the CampusGroups

- 27 platform, and an overwhelming number of these organizations are tied back to the Student
- Assembly in some way, the VP of Finance often needs to reference admin-level information to
- 29 perform their role.

| 51 | allocation cycle will be significantly hindered if admin-level access is not granted back to them. |

| 54 | on numerous occasions that there will be a significant delay in sending out the 2024-2026 SAF      |
