13	Whereas, CRP encourages lifelong learning, creating newspaper readership habits, and increasing
14	student awareness of local, national, and international events;

17	Times;

19	Whereas, CRP allocated \$5.00/student/year in the 2016-2018 byline cycle;

21	Whereas, CRP currently maintains a surplus in excess of \$100,000 after ending the relationship with
22	USA Today;

24	Whereas, students across business courses are currently required to purchase Wall Street Journal
25	(WSJ) access at a semester cost of \$15;
26	
27	Whereas, numerous employers require knowledge attained from member-only articles in the WSJ;

29	Be it therefore resolved , the Student Assembly use the funds originally intended for the USA
30	Today subscription to expand the Collegiate Readership Program by partnering with the
31	WSJ;

33	Be it finally resolved, the SA allocate funds from aforementioned surplus toward an
34	undergraduate-wide subscription of the WSJ at \$1.75/student/year with professors of said
35	students gaining free access.
