

Resolution 1: Starbucks Off Our Campus

- 2 Abstract: This resolution proposed a University policy that terminates Cornell University's
- 3 relationship with Starbucks Coffee in response to their repeated illegal anti-worker efforts,
- 4 including the closing of union stores in Ithaca, New York.

- Whereas, Ithaca, New York is the first and only town in America where 100% of Starbucks
- workers are unionized;
- Whereas, Starbucks announced on May 5. that they would be permanently shutting down all
- three corporate-owned stores in Ithaca;
- Whereas, Starbucks has repeatedly engaged in illegal union-busting tactics across the country,
- including in Ithaca, where the NLRB found several violations against the company and ordered
- 18 the reopening of their Collegetown location that was closed in retaliation;
- 19 Whereas, Cornell maintains licensing relationships with other coffee companies, and has the
- 20 demonstrated capacity to serve coffee on campus without working with Starbucks;
- Whereas, the Charter of the Student Assembly in Article III, Section 1 provides, "the SA will
- 22 have legislative authority over the policies of the Department of Campus Life and the Office of
- 23 the Dean of Students, and will have the authority to review the budgets and actions of said
- 24 departments" which thereby vests it with the authority, provided the asset of the University
- 25 President is given, to determine policy for the Department of Student and Campus Life and it
- subordinate entities, including Cornell Dining;
- Now, Be it therefore resolved, that it shall be the policy of the Department of Student and
- 28 Campus Life and Cornell Dining to reassess its relationship with Starbucks and withdraw from
- 29 the 'We Proudly Serve Starbucks program no later than the beginning of the Fall 2023 Semester;
- 30 **Be it further resolved,** that for the purposes of this resolution, "Starbucks products" shall be
- defined as all products sold under the 'Starbucks We Proudly Serve' line;
- 32 **Be it finally resolved,** the Cornell Student Assembly requires that the University, through the
- 33 Department of Student and Campus Life and Cornell Dining, commits to no longer serving
- 34 Starbucks branded products in dining locations, and collaborating with student advocates and
