Johnson College of Business during the 2016-2017 Academic Year; 13 14 Whereas, the S.C. Johnson College of Business is intended to enhance the student experience cross-15 functionally through the pooled resources of its three component schools: Charles H. Dyson School of 16 Applied Economics and Management, Johnson Graduate School of Management; and the School of Hotel 17 Administration; 18 19 Whereas, the Breazzano Family Center for Business opened in Fall of 2017 at 209-215 Dryden Road; 20 21 Whereas, the Breazzano Family Center for Business expands the teaching capacity of the S.C. Johnson 22 College of Business; 23 24 Whereas, the Breazzano Family Center for Business is inaccessible to undergraduate students after 25 5:00pm; 26 27 Whereas, daytime classes for undergraduate students don't finish until 4:30pm; 28 29 Whereas, since the restructuring of the Charles H. Dyson School of Applied Economics and 30 Management, Johnson Graduate School of Management, and the School of Hotel Administration into the 31 S.C. Johnson College of Business, few tangible steps have been taken to improve undergraduate access to 32 additional resources and experiences; 33 34 Whereas, there are inadequate study spaces in Collegetown for undergraduate students to do work 35 despite the large volume of students that live in Collegetown; 36 37 Whereas, other Cornell-funded study spaces, such as Uris Library, already have systems in place for 38 ensuring that only certain students are allowed to work there beyond a certain point in the night; 39 40 Whereas, campus safety has become a major concern due to recent rising racial tensions and hate crimes

Whereas, additional study spaces in Collegetown would eradicate the need for students to walk long-

on Cornell's campus as well as a longstanding history of sexual assault;
