2	Expanding Bike Share on Campus
3 4 5 6	ABSTRACT: This resolution calls for the University to assess the viability of implementing a vendor operated dockless bike share on campus.

9 10 11	Whereas, bicycling can offer a convenient, affordable, and sustainable method of transportation; and
12 13 14 15	Whereas, campus bike share has been highlighted as an innovation goals in the transportation section of the Cornell Climate Action Plan with next steps including "expanded or reciprocal Cornell-Ithaca bike share(s)"; and
16 17 18	Whereas, campus bus routes are often overburdened with no publicly available plans to increase capacity; and
19 20 21	<b>Whereas,</b> planned expansions of housing on North Campus and in East Hill are likely to increase demand on campus transit routes; and
22 23 24	Whereas, increasing bicycle mode share for short trips can ameliorate burden on campus transit routes; and
25 26 27	Whereas, many students cannot easily bring a personal bicycle to Cornell, and few student residential options provide adequate secure bicycle parking; and
28 29 30	Whereas, a bike share can provide a convenient, low-cost option for students and employees who otherwise have no easy access to bicycles, and
31 32	Whereas, a bike share can support both commuting students and employees in adopting alternatives to single occupant vehicle commuting, and
33 34 35 36 37	Whereas, a successful bike share pilot program operated by Zagster and overseen by Big Red Bikes and Cornell Transportation Services brought 32 bikes to campus providing 5837 rides for 1195 unique users from April 2017 through April 2018; and
38 39 40 41	Whereas, many members of the Cornell community have requested lower cost access to shared bikes, a larger fleet of shared bikes, and the ability to begin and end trips in more locations around campus as well as in Collegetown and other off-campus destinations; and
42 43	<b>Whereas,</b> the Zagster program is scheduled to end as of July 15, and no funding is available for contract renewal; and



**Whereas,** Ithaca Carshare and the City of Ithaca are overseeing a dockless bike share system operated by Limebike that recently launched in April 2018; and

**Whereas,** Limebike has successfully implemented dockless bike share systems at over 16 US universities since May 2017 including the University of North Carolina Greensboro, University of Notre Dame, University of Washington, and Duke University; and

Whereas, dockless bike share provides bicycles that can be located via GPS and locked or unlocked wherever bicycle parking is allowed for \$1/hour or \$.50 for those with a .edu email address; and

Whereas, without official University endorsement Limebike won't be able to distribute bikes on campus although individuals Ithaca bike share users will likely bring them to campus as a popular local destination; and

Whereas, for a dockless bike share program on campus to be successful, it is crucial that bikes be operated and secured with attention to and respect for safety of all community members, facilitation of university operations, and maintenance of orderly campus appearance; and

Whereas, a formal memorandum of understanding with Limebike would allow the University to set clear standards of performance and operations, including collaboration on public education and safety campaigns to ensure correct and safe usage on campus, as well as establish expectations for maintenance, distribution, and correct parking; and

**Whereas,** dockless bike share programs operated by Limebike incur no direct cost to the campuses and communities where they are located.

Be it therefore resolved, the Student Assembly calls upon the University to take advantage of the time between the Ithaca Limebike launch in late April and the beginning of the 2018 fall semester to assess the performance and impact of the Ithaca Limebike implementation, to assess the potential benefits to the campus community and institutional goals, as well as risks and incidental costs to university operations, and to consider whether a formal extension of the community dockless bike share to the campus can be congruent with university priorities; and

**Be it further resolved,** the Student Assembly will assist Big Red BIkes in distributing a public education and communication plan to ensure safe and orderly use of shared bikes on campus; and

**Be it finally resolved,** that the Student Assembly applauds and supports Transportation Services and the Campus Planning Office's efforts to investigate opportunities to better accommodate increased bicycle mode share through bike sharing, as well as support improvements in bicycle infrastructure, regulations, and policies in any upcoming transportation plans.
