4 5 6	ABSTRACT: This resolution affirms the Student Assembly's solidarity with the Cornell community and requests the appropriate considerations and additions to the Campus Code of Conduct through the University Assembly Codes and Judicial Committee.

11 12 12	Whereas, over the past year there has been an increase in hate-based incidents on college campuses across the country;
13 14	Whereas on September (2017 one or more Zeta Dei member(a) shouted "build a wall around the
15	Whereas, on September 6, 2017 one or more Zeta Psi member(s) shouted "build a wall around the LLC" at the Latino Living Center;
16	
17 18	Whereas, on September 15, 2017 multiple alleged Psi Upsilon members, a fraternity no longer affiliated with Cornell University, used racial slurs against a Black Cornell student and
18 19	violently assaulted him and other members of his fraternity on their own property;
20	violently assaulted min and other members of his fraterinty on their own property,
21 22	Whereas, later the same day on September 15, 2017, two or more Cornell students were captured on video using racial slurs against another student;

24 25	Whereas, all of these incidents appear to be clear violations of the Campus Code of Conduct, should the allegations prove true, as it is a violation of the Campus Code of Conduct to:
26 27 28 29	• "harass another personby acting toward that person in a manner that is by objective measure threatening, abusive, or severely annoying and that is beyond the scope of free speech," or
30	 "assault or cause any physical injury to another person on the basis of disability,
30 31	ethnicity, gender, national origin, race, religion, or sexual orientation or affectional
32	preference;"

34	Whereas, the Ithaca Police have arrested one student allegedly involved on September 15 and
35	charged said student with one count of assault in the third degree; and later the
36	
37	Whereas, the Ithaca police are investigating the events of September 15 as a possible hate crime;

39	Whereas, pursuant to New York State Penal Law Article 485, hate crimes "do more than threaten
40	the safety and welfare of all citizens" because they "inflict on victims incalculable physical
41	and emotional damage and tear at the very fabric of free society," "send a powerful message
42	of intolerance and discrimination" and "disrupt entire communities and vitiate the civility
43	that is essential to healthy democratic processes;"

45	Whereas, bias, discrimination, and hate crimes, by their nature, affect the fabric of the Cornell
46	community, prevent the fulfillment of and are deeply antithetical to Cornell's motto "I
47	would found an institution where any person can find instruction in any study;"

49	Whereas, these recent events place the onus on Cornell University to establish and justify its
50	members' trust in our community;

52	Whereas, we, the Student Assembly, acknowledge that violence is not merely interpersonal, but also
53	institutional and historic;

55	Be it therefore resolved, that the Student Assembly unequivocally condemns all forms of the

62	consider how best to heal these harms, and how best to accord all members of our
63	community the equal dignity and respect due to them as our peers;

65	Be it further resolved, that the Student Assembly calls on the University Assembly Codes and
66	Judicial Committee to expedite consideration of Campus Code of Conduct changes
67	requested by Black Students United;

69	Be it finally resolved, that the Student Assembly calls on the University Assembly Codes and
70	Judicial Committee to add "documentation status" to the Code of Conduct Title III, Article
71	II, Section A.
