39 **Whereas**, academic transparency can be significantly improved by reinstating the publication of
40 median grades, in addition to maintaining them on student transcripts; and

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42 **Whereas**, the Faculty Senate has the authority to reinstate the publication of median grades,
43 reintroducing the Truth in Grading concept; and

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45 **Be it therefore resolved**, that the Student Assembly calls on the Faculty Senate to investigate the
46 possibility of reinstating the semesterly reporting of median grades.

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48 **Be it further resolved**, that such investigation shall include, but is not limited to the following:
49 median grade reports since 2011 and feedback from faculty, undergraduate and
50 graduate/professional students.

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52 **Be it finally resolved**, that said investigation include the following: how enrollment would be
53 impacted, correlation between student satisfaction and median grades, how overall median
54 grade trends have shifted since the cease of publication of median grades in 2011, and how
55 other schools have been impacted by public median grades
