4 5 6 7 8	ABSTRACT: This resolution charges an ad-hoc committee with the responsibility of studying and investigating the SA's current membership and operational structure and issuing a formal set of recommendations to the SA on how to improve representation.
9	Sponsored by: Gabe Kaufman '18, Akhilesh Issur '17
10 11 12 13	Whereas, the Student Assembly desires to evaluate its internal procedures and membership structure to better represent an increasingly diverse student body; and
14 15 16	Whereas, any changes to the fundamental structure of representative institutions should be made with serious, careful, and open public deliberation; and
17 18 19	Whereas, the Student Assembly wants to encourage dialogue across all student constituencies about the structure of the SA; and
20 21 22	Whereas, the Student Assembly wants to begin the aforementioned membership and operational self-evaluation process as soon as possible; and
23 24 25	Whereas, both prior experience with the SA and a new perspective on the SA are extremely valuable in studying our representative structure; and
26 27 28 29	Be it therefore resolved , that an ad-hoc investigatory committee titled "The Student Assembly Investigative Committee on Membership Reform" (hereafter: SAICMR) be established effective immediately; and
30 31 32 33	Be it further resolved , that SAICMR will be charged with the sole responsibility of compiling a set of unbiased recommendations to be presented to the Assembly by the final SA meeting of the current session of the Assembly on how the Student Assembly can better represent students; and
34 35 36 37 38	Be it further resolved, that all SAICMR meetings will be held at least once every month, will be accessible and open to the public, and will have an agenda and appended documentation forwarded to all SAICMR and Assembly members at least 24 hours before the date when committee meetings are held; and
39 40	Be it further resolved , that the nine members of SAICMR will be representative of the whole Assembly, will be undergraduate students, and will be defined as follows:
41 42	SAICMR Chair: Voting member elected by the Student Assembly
43 44	SAICMR Members:
45 46	 One voting member belonging to the executive committee. Two voting members not belonging to the executive committee.

47	 Two underclassmen voting members not belonging to the executive committee
48	 One non-elected Student Assembly committee member.
49	Non-SA Members:
50	 One former voting member of the Assembly who is no longer serving.
51	 One candidate who ran in the Fall or Spring 2016 Student Assembly Election but was
52	not seated.
53	 Two members who have not run in an election or applied to a committee.
54	Two additional community members.
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56	Be it finally resolved, that the Assembly will appoint a slate of community members proposed by the
57	Vice President for Internal Operations and the chair of the committee after two forums, and will appoin
58	Assembly members through normal procedures in executive session.

S.A. Resolution #12 Empowering All Students in the Restructuring of Student Assembly

ABSTRACT: This resolution seeks to empower all students in the restructuring of the Student Assembly.

Sponsored by: Paola Muñoz '17, Nicholas Karavolias '18

Whereas, the Student Assembly does not represent all students. This was affirmed by the 2015-2016 Student Assembly in their discussions surrounding the creation of the First Generation Student Representative. This resolution was adopted unanimously by the previous assembly;

Whereas, there are significant barriers for students to gaining membership on the Student Assembly and these barriers need to be removed. Some of these barriers include elitist language, access to accommodation, and more;

Whereas, non-members of the Student Assembly are left out of many discussions and decisions that impact the student experience, as a result of ineffective outreach;

Whereas, Student Assembly members have a responsibility to represent their constituencies; however, they rarely inform or consult members of their constituencies before voting on resolutions on the floor of the Student Assembly;

Whereas, all students are stakeholders in the representative structure of the Student Assembly;

Be it therefore resolved, this resolution empowers and encourages each and every member of the Student Assembly to convene open working groups to discuss restructuring the Student Assembly;

Be it further resolved, the Student Assembly empowers and encourages all undergraduate students to participate in the restructuring process and to conduct discussions and convene working groups on the restructuring of the Student Assembly;

Be it further resolved, that all undergraduate students may send recommendations to studentassembly@cornell.edu by October 31st at noon. All proposals shall be made publically available and shared with the undergraduate student body by **November 1st at noon.** Additionally, a form shall be made available for all students to provide comments electronically if they are unable to attend the forum;

Be it further resolved, that all ideas and proposals be discussed at an open forum held on **Wednesday November 2**nd **from 5:30-7:30pm.** The Student Assembly President shall moderate the forum and shall prioritize non-Student Assembly members on the speakers list. At the end of the forum, all participants shall be given a voice and a vote in what the next step forward is. Additionally, notes from the forum shall be made publically available to all members of the student body;

Be it further resolved, that all Student Assembly members shall be required to attend this forum and the attendance policy be in effect;

46	Be it further resolved, that an independent organization such as Cornell Institutional Research and
47	Planning assist in compiling the opinions of the student body toward the structure of the Student
48	Assembly;
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50	Be it further resolved, that the final decision about restructuring should provide a mechanism for all
51	students who choose to participate to have an equal voice and vote;
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53	Be it further resolved, that if the restructuring process is completed by the first week in February that
54	the Student Assembly update its internal documents and election rules to echo the will of the student
55	body and to implement the new structure for the Spring 2017 election;
