## Making the UA Charter Gender-neutral [05/04/2021]

3 4	Whereas, the Charter of the University Assembly uses the terms "he" and "she;" and
5	Whereas, section 5.3(c), states: If, after the floor is closed for nominations for specific officer
6	position, only one candidate is nominated to be an officer, he or she will be seated
7	immediately, unless a member of the Assembly opposes the nomination; and
8	
9	Whereas, many individuals in the Cornell community do not identify with these terms; and
10	
11	Whereas, this item affects members of the Cornell community and falls within the purview of
12	the University Assembly.

14	Be it therefore resolved, section 5.3(c) of the University Charter will now read: If, after the
15	floor is closed for nominations for a specific officer position, only one candidate is
16	nominated to be an officer, they will be seated immediately, unless a member of the
17	Assembly opposes the nomination; and

19	<b>Resolved,</b> the University Assembly asks the Administration to consider this change to the
20	University Assembly Charter; and
21 22	Be it finally resolved, the University Assembly replace all language pertaining to gender with
23	gender-neutral language.
