7	Whereas, the University Assembly (the "Assembly") has the authority to examine matters which
8	concern the welfare of a substantial segment of the campus community and may make
9	recommendations thereon to the President or other appropriate officers of the university, and

1	Whereas, the Office of the Judicial Codes Counselor ("JCC") provides free assistance and
2	representation within the campus judicial system to those charged with violations within the
13	Campus Code of Conduct (the "Code") and to students charged with violations of the Code of
4	Academic Integrity, and

6	Whereas, the Assembly believes the JCC is a vital and necessary component of Cornell's
7	judicial process, and

9	Whereas, JCC is comprised of law students who are inexperienced when compared to the length
20	of service represented in Office of the Judicial Administrator who receives, investigates and
21	adjudicates complaints alleging violations of the Code, and
22 23 24 25 26	Whereas, the JCC does not currently have a faculty advisor, and
23	vincteas, the Jee does not currently have a faculty advisor, and
25	Whereas, the members of the JCC would benefit from the personal mentorship, advice, and
26	assistance of a professional advisor in the execution of their duties, and

28	Whereas, the Cornell community would likely benefit from improved quality of JCC work,
29	gained through the support of a mentor to advise assist the members of the Office, as needed, and

31	Whereas, the members of the JCC already seek out law faculty for help in difficult cases,
