Requesting Information on the Cost of Carbon Neutrality

4	Whereas, the University administration, despite endorsing the desirability of carbon neutrality
5	by 2035 several times, has not determined the actual costs associated with carbon
6	neutrality; and
7	
8	Whereas, understanding the cost and benefits associated with carbon neutrality would greatly
9	inform the current debate by allowing each constituency to weigh the costs and benefits
10	thereof and would empower each constituent assembly to make specific suggestions to
11	the administration regarding changes in practices and policies towards that end; and

13	Whereas, Article III, Sub-Section 3.1.1, Sub-point A, of the University Assembly Charter states
14	that "to the extent practical and appropriate, University officials will provide pertinent
15	information as the Assembly requests;" therefore
16	
17	Be it resolved, that the University Assembly formally requests that the University administration
18	determine and provide an informed analysis regarding the costs and benefits of becoming
19	carbon neutral at Cornell's Ithaca campus and nearby Cornell facilities; and

21	Resolved , that the results of the cost determination be formally presented to the University
22	Assembly by January of 2017 or as soon as reliable information has been obtained; and

24	Be it Finally Resolved, that the administrative unit responsible for overseeing the cost
25	calculation make a preliminary report to the University Assembly in the fall of 2016.
