## **Requesting Information on the Cost of Carbon Neutrality**

4	Whereas, the University administration has decided that it will not honor the commitment
5	President Skorton made to make Cornell carbon neutral by 2035; and
6	
7	Whereas, the reason cited for this decision is that the cost of carbon neutrality is high or at least
8	presently unknown; and
9	Williams the Haller of the decision of the decision of the control
10	Whereas, the University administration, despite endorsing the possibility of carbon neutrality
11 12	several times, has not determined the actual costs associated with carbon neutrality; and
13	Whereas, understanding the cost and benefits associated with carbon neutrality would greatly
14	inform the current debate by allowing each constituency to weigh the costs and benefits
15	thereof and would empower each constituent assembly to make specific suggestions to
16	the administration regarding changes in practices and policies towards that end; and

18	Whereas, Article III, Sub-Section 3.1.1, Sub-point A, of the University Assembly Charter states
19	that "to the extent practical and appropriate, University officials will provide pertinent
20	information as the Assembly requests;" therefore

22	Be it resolved, that the University Assembly formally requests that the University administration
23	determine and provide an informed analysis regarding the costs and benifits of becoming
24	carbon neutral at Cornell's Ithaca campus and nearby Cornell facilities; and

26	<b>Resolved,</b> that the results of the cost determination be formally presented to the University
27	Assembly by January of 2017 or as soon as reliable information has been obtained; and
28 29	<b>Resolved,</b> that the administrative unit responsible for overseeing the cost calculation make a
30	preliminary report to the University Assembly in the fall of 2016; and
31	promining report to the oniversity Assembly in the rail of 2010, and
32	Be it Finally Resolved, that a copy of this resolution be sent to the President, Acting President,



and the Senior Leadership Climate Action Group.
